MRTA Informative & Protective Services Committee Goals and Duties 2017

CHARGE: To encourage MRTA Unit Informative & Protective Services (IPS) committee leaders to provide education retirees with valuable information so that all school personnel may live healthy, vital lives and be secure economically, socially and professionally in retirement.

AGENDA: To increase MRTA membership through fellowship and provide information important to MRTA retirees that will affect their quality of life in retirement.

2017 FOCUS: To focus on providing MRTA members with information regarding identity theft and cyber security awareness.

HOW: By promoting the name of MRTA to active and retired school personnel through MRTA Informative & Protective Services Committee information and activities.

By:

- 1) Encouraging all local units to have an IPS Committee chairperson and for them to arrange for IPS programs or handouts at each unit meeting. In addition, information can be disbursed through phone calls, newsletters, or emails.
- 2) Monitoring the MRTA website, IPS page, social media, and Facebook for new activities and reports that may be shared at local unit meetings.
- 3) Reminding members about the easy access to IPS reports and activities on the MRTA website and Facebook.
- 4) Inviting representatives from various organizations specializing in information important to retirees on the unit, regional and state levels. (There is a list of possible organizations to invite on the MRTA website such as: The Missouri Attorney General's Office and Forrest T. Jones & Co.)
- 5) Participating in National Cyber Security Month in October as a statewide IPS project.
